


















Kingsbury T-Shirts - Now Available Online!


That says it all, doesn't it?!

Valentine's Day

This Friday, February 14th, is Valentine's Day.

The traditions of Valentine's Day are broad and many. It is a time to exchange cards or small gifts. Chocolates, flowers, jewelry, and romantic dinners are the big hits of this holiday.

It is a romantic event for lovers, and a fun event for kids and family. Many a couple become **engaged** or wed on this day. For others it is a day to fall in love.

But it didn't start that way!

On February 14, around the year 278 A.D., Valentine, a holy priest in Rome in the days of Emperor Claudius II, was executed.

Under the rule of Claudius the Cruel, Rome was involved in many unpopular and bloody campaigns. The emperor had to maintain a strong army, but was having a difficult time getting soldiers to join his military leagues. Claudius believed that Roman men were unwilling to join the army because of their strong attachment to their wives and families.

To get rid of the problem, Claudius banned all marriages and engagements in Rome. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death. Valentine was arrested and dragged before the Prefect of Rome, who condemned him to be beaten to death with clubs and to have his head cut off. The sentence was carried out on February 14, on or about the year 270.

Legend also has it that while in jail, St. Valentine left a farewell note for the jailer's daughter, who had become his friend, and signed it "From Your Valentine."

For his great service, Valentine was named a saint after his death.

Did you know? While 75% of chocolate purchases are made by women all year long, during the days and minutes before Valentine's Day, 75% of the chocolate purchases are made by men.

Tuesday, February 18 - First day of early voting


Friday, February 21 - Last day to apply for ballot by mail (received, not postmarked)

Full Super Snow Moon

Tonight, the Full Super Snow Moon will rise.

According to the Farmers' Almanac, northeastern Native American tribes referred to the second full moon of winter as the Snow Moon because of February's heavy snow.

This year, it's a **supermoon** (the orbit of the moon will bring it closer to Earth), which means it will be one of the biggest moons of 2020 and will look especially large when rising and setting. The moonrise will be at 6:46 pm. our time tonight, according to NASA. So bundle up, celebrate and get excited for the first super moon of 2020!

Do supermoons truly appear brighter? Technically, yes. Practically, it depends on your point of comparison. The supermoon's diameter is indeed about 7% greater than an ordinary full Moon and 14% greater than a full Moon when it's at its furthest point in its orbit to Earth (a "micromoon").

And a supermoon exceeds the brightness of an ordinary Moon by 15%! When compared to a micromoon, the supermoon is 30% brighter!

MOON FACTS AND FOLKLORE

On February 6, 1971, Alan Shepard became the first man to hit a golf ball on the Moon.

Did you know that the Moon's diameter is 2,160 miles? This is less than the width of the United States (approximately 3,000 miles), and 0.27 of Earth's diameter (7,926 miles).

Wolves have howled at the Moon for centuries, yet it is still there.

Arapaho - Frost Sparkling in the Sun Moon
Chocktaw - Moon of Winds
Cree - Old Moon
Hopi - Moon of Purification and Renewal
Mohawk - Lateness Moon
Pueblo - Moon of the Cedar Dust Wind
Shoshone - Coyote Moon

Colonial American - Trapper's Moon Celtic - Moon of Ice Medieval English - Storm Moon Neo Pagan - Snow Moon
